

Train enthusiasts and RVers alike find plenty to do and see at this Georgia resort

You don't have to be into trains to find joy at this Greensboro, Georgia, resort, but it helps. The 55-acre campground, recently acquired by Travel Resorts of America, features 23 authentic railroad boxcars, club cars, and cabooses. In addition to their use as offices and shops, 10 train cars offer comfy accommodations for overnight stays. Cottages can be rented and RVers are treated to spacious RV sites with full hook-ups and Wi-Fi.

The "landing" part of the resort's name refers to the fact the campground is situated on Lake Oconee, a reservoir with 374 miles of shoreline. Visitors to the resort can take advantage of the private white sand beach, boat slips and launch, and fishing—so don't forget to bring your fishing gear, swimsuits, and water toys, big or little.

Other amenities include a 4,000-square-foot clubhouse, two pools, gated security, walking trails, four entertainment pavilions, and covered picnic areas. Play games galore in

the clubhouse game room or outside on the game courts. And of course there's a playground for the younger campers.

Offsite, the town of Greensboro offers an array of shops, historic attractions, and world-class golf. Greensboro is steeped in Southern history

and tradition, and rich with elegant antebellum homes and churches. It's also the county seat of Green County. The county's courthouse, constructed around 1848, is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Other historic monuments include the Iron House, a massive 2,000-pound structure, and the "Gaol," a Bastille-like jail that is one of the oldest penal structures in Georgia.

Lake Oconee is home to 10 championship golf courses designed by some of the greatest golf course designers in the world. If you're feeling fancy, head to the Harbor Club on Lake Oconee, a premier course that was named one of the Top 10 Golf Courses in the State of Georgia.
